Dear Brothers and Sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

As we consider the unwavering faithfulness and love of God, we are compelled to return thanks to Him not only in this holiday season, but every day. He is certainly worthy of our admiration and praise.

Here we share with you how the Lord has cared for our family over the last year.

Adjusted Ministry

Since our last newsletter we sent out a year ago, we have continued serving the Lord in several areas, although we found it necessary to limit some ministry involvement while we were earnestly seeking answers and resolution for the fatigue that has been debilitating our son, Lucas. We thank those of you who were aware of his condition and have been praying for his improvement.

During this period, Manuel continued in his teaching ministry in our local assembly, working through the Gospel according to John, with the goal of helping the saints to gain a deeper understanding about God the Son, and a closer fellowship with Him as we exercise trust in Him.

We also continued our weekly trips to the small town of Santa Olalla to meet with our three brothers in Christ there, to fellowship with them and encourage them in the unique challenges each of them face. We worked through some Emmaus courses to help them grow in their understanding of important biblical truths.

Also, during our family "medical year", Tracy minimized her involvement in the women's magazine and other areas of service to devote her time to Lucas's needs. The Lord provided, however, for her to continue her weekly visits with Gloria, our elderly sister in Christ, to help her with technology and other practical needs, and to enjoy fellowship together.

Travels and Transitions

We thank the Lord that after more than a year of doctor visits and medical tests, we now have some direction to help Lucas navigate his tiredness.

As he returned to his interrupted studies this fall, we were convinced that we needed to provide closer support

to him for a time until he regains strength. Therefore, when he resumed his studies at LeTourneau University in Texas, we remained in town to continue helping him as he transitioned back to life on campus after his year of absence.

Late Summer and Fall

Before we took Lucas back to college, in late summer we were glad for the opportunity to travel to Oregon to visit family, friends, and our commending assembly, Westside Bible Fellowship. We were blessed to enjoy several encouraging visits with our brothers and sisters in Christ during our limited time there.

In August we traveled to Texas and helped Lucas move back to campus. Shortly afterward we helped Tomás pack his belongings, load a U-Haul truck, and move from Little Rock, AR to Franklin, TN where he relocated to the Nashville office of the FDIC. There he is happily, yet busily employed, and is glad to be back in Tennessee where he has college friends to fellowship with.

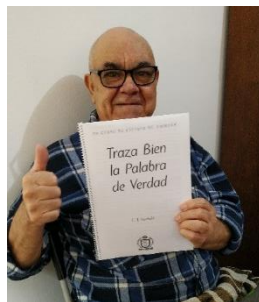


We thank the Lord for His provision in the lives of both of our children, and we look to Him to continue caring for them and drawing their hearts closer to Himself.

- God's protection for Manuel as he makes some repairs in our house, and as he travels each week to meet with the brothers in Santa Olalla.
