Thank you for continuing to uphold us in prayer, especially as we process the home-calling of our good friend and co-worker Samweli.

PRAISE the Lord with us that the funeral for Samweli went very well. We were able to transport the body back up to his home near Gisuru about 4.5 hours drive away. Around 400 friends and neighbors attended the funeral and heard the gospel preached very clearly and powerfully by my friend Salatier.

Two projects that have been heavy on our heart since Samweli's death are the construction of a new building for Munyinya (the local church where Samweli served) and helping his widow and seven children finish a house that he had just started building before he died.

The church is in need of a bigger building, currently about 50 of the 150 regular members stand outside the building every Sunday for the service.

PRAY for a team of over 10 local builders from 2 churches near the city of Bujumbura who will be heading up to Munyinya on Monday to volunteer their time to begin construction on the new building. They will be going up in a dump truck that has been loaned for free by an elder from Bujumbura who has a construction business. It is great to see the partnership and generosity of these local brothers.

PRAY for provision for the roofing for the new church building. They will need completely new roofing because they would like to keep the old building standing to be used for Sunday School work, so that they can split the Sunday School into 2 groups.

GISURU HOUSE CONSTRUCTION

PRAISE the Lord for the progress on the guest house, last week I went up with the plumber and electrician and got most of the plumbing done and the small solar system installed!

PRAY for the Lord's continued provision as we finish furnishing the house and build a perimeter wall around the housing area.

PRAY also that we would be able to get water. We have a water hook up from the town right now, but they have turned it off for the past 4 months saying that there is not enough water for us in their system.

So in order for us to get reliable water we might need to install our own water pipe from the town's spring 3 kilometer's (about 2 miles) away. This will cost a lot of money (around \$7,000), so pray that either they will stop turning us off, or that God would provide the funds to be able to run our own pipe.
